

Isaiah 6:1-8

In the year King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. 2 Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. 3 And one called to another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory."

4 The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. 5 And I said: "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!"

6 Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. 7 The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: "Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." 8 Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!"

Isaiah describes a scene both powerful and awe-inspiring. The Lord sits on an elevated throne. The wording suggest Isaiah can see the deity only from the waist down, so Isaiah does not see God's face. Nevertheless, Isaiah can see the seraphs above the deity, so his perspective creates some confusion.

The Lord's robes -- from the waist down -- fill the heavenly "temple." This indicates Isaiah sees a massive God, evoking a sense of power and strength. It appears the seraphs are flying serpents, with six pairs of wings. One pair covers their eyes, so they cannot see the divine face. Smoke billows out; the whole temple shakes. The cries of the seraphs lift up God's holiness and glory. There is no hint of weakness. God is strong, holy and glorious.

Yet, even with this beautifully descriptive passage, one thing is clear, our author is unable to fully describe the awesomeness of God. And, perhaps that is one of the messages he wishes to convey to us.....God is awesome beyond description. Another important message is: God wants us to do His work. He calls us to service. Are we volunteering like Isaiah or do we shy away from God's calling?

I pray we may all say, "Here am I; send me!"


