2 Corinthians 4:5-12

<sup>5</sup> For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. <sup>6</sup> For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

<sup>7</sup> But we have this treasure in clay jars, so it may be made clear this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. <sup>8</sup> We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; <sup>9</sup> persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; <sup>10</sup> always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. <sup>11</sup> For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. <sup>12</sup> So death is at work in us, but life in you.

I heard a cute story about a child who finally began to face up to the fragility of his belief in the Tooth Fairy. He confronted his mother and asked her, "Mom, are you the Tooth Fairy?"

Well, she gave a little sigh, now that the secret was out, and because this marked a rite of passage; which was the end of the innocence. With the sigh, she gave a little nod and said, "Uh, yes, honey, I guess I kind of am."

Well, the child accepted the revelation without freaking out. But a moment later he asked her: "So how do you get into all the other kids' houses?"

It's important to separate fact from fiction. It's equally important for God's people to separate fiction from fact. Paul wants to be perfectly clear with the people of Corinth it is God who shines in his heart "to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ."

He also makes it clear life is fragile. Therefore, any power we may have comes from God, not from humans. God is our life-giving power. Like a child, we may wish to cling to the myth we are 10 feet tall and bullet proof but the fact is, we are children of God, empowered by God.

God which is at Corinth," although the scholarly consensus holds  
Sosthenes was the assistant who wrote down the text of the letter  
at Paul's direction.

Called "a masterpiece of pastoral theology", it addresses various  
issues that had arisen in the Christian community at Corinth.

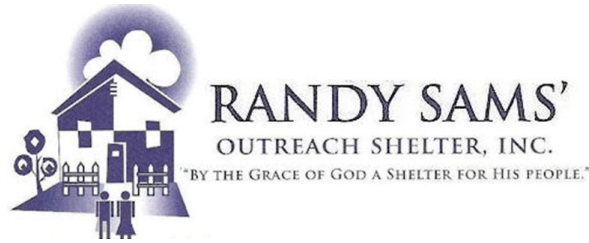
