³⁰ They went on from there and passed through Galilee. He did not want anyone to know it; ³¹ for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of Man is to be betrayed into human hands, and they will kill him, and three days after being killed, he will rise again." ³² But they did not understand what he was saying and were afraid to ask him.

³³ Then they came to Capernaum; and when he was in the house he asked them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" ³⁴ But they were silent, for on the way they had argued with one another who was the greatest. ³⁵ He sat down, called the twelve, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all." ³⁶ Then he took a little child and put the child among them; and taking the child in his arms, he said to them, ³⁷ "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me."

In our synoptic Gospels, Jesus never beats around the bush as to whom is to be worshipped. Let's look at verse 37 closely: "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me."

Notice Jesus says, "NOT me but the one who sent me." Jesus came to proclaim God as Father and Lord of all. And not just that, but to show us what God is like and what God likes: To reveal God as a loving and forgiving God, not the cruel, vengeful God the Old Testament speaks of.

And interestingly, although we rarely say or even realize, God is a servant to all of us. Now this may be shocking to read or hear, but Jesus makes it clear God is here FOR US: That God wants to be here for us and want to SERVE us as the God and Father of all creation.

Jesus lives out this servanthood as an example of his Father's goodness and willingness to serve His creation. God does not demand any praise or thanks for what He does but Jesus instructs us to praise and thank His father every day for the many blessings He provides us. After all, "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all."

Are you a good servant? Are you welcoming?

Thoughts on Stewardship

As we embark on our 2018 Stewardship Campaign for the 2019 budget, I would like to share some thoughts for your consideration.

A biblical view of stewardship can be defined as "utilizing and managing <u>all</u> resources God provides for the glory of God and the betterment of his creation." In Matthew 25:14-30, Jesus communicates a spiritual truth—that of stewarding the gifts he has entrusted to us. These could be talents and abilities or they might be the very message of grace he has entrusted us with. We don't all receive the same gifts, but we're all expected to return our master's investment.

As Christians, we believe God doesn't only want our money, but our whole lives. Everyone agrees generosity and stewardship are valuable virtues to practice, but are we giving God our First and Finest. He asked for the <u>First</u> and <u>Finest</u> of what the people had to offer. We are called to give for 2 reasons—1) he is worthy of our gift, and 2) it is a tangible way we put <u>Him</u> first in our lives. A gift that honors God is one that requires sacrifice, because that is the gift that reflects our hearts.

When we're living with a spirit of gratitude toward God, we're practicing biblical stewardship. That means living our lives every day acknowledging every resource, every dollar, every second of time, belongs to God. It's all His, and we're his managers.

Why do we give? We give to be more like Christ.

If you are unable to attend Sunday service and desire to have communion brought to you, please call the church office at (903) 792-1915 with your request.


This communion is normally served on the 2nd and 4th Sundays but CAN be served most anytime, if prior arrangements are made.
