

Mark 9:38-41

John said to him, "Teacher, we saw someone casting out demons in your name, and we tried to stop him, because he was not following us." ³⁹ But Jesus said, "Do not stop him; for no one who does a deed of power in my name will be able soon afterward to speak evil of me. ⁴⁰ Whoever is not against us is for us. ⁴¹ For truly I tell you, whoever gives you a cup of water to drink because you bear the name of Christ will by no means lose the reward.

As you may have heard me say in my sermon last Sunday, it is paramount we have God's Mission in our hearts and on our minds than trying to convert someone to the Christian faith. Other than the scripture about the ten lepers, this scripture reinforces my belief.

Once again we are not told the faith of the person who is casting out demons in Jesus' name, we only know it is not Jesus or one of his disciples AND this person IS in fact casting out demons as witnessed by John and others. Clearly, Jesus does not care about the person's belief system, background or anything else, only that the person is doing God's work. Wouldn't we have a better world if we were more concerned about the teachings of Jesus, the mission of Jesus, than the conversion of others to our beliefs?

God sent Jesus on a mission. Not a mission of conversion to Judaism, but on a mission of conversion to God's mission of showing mercy, love and forgiveness to everyone AND wanting that passed on from generation to generation. If we in fact did live out God's mission, I believe we would have a much better world. Perhaps even a "near" perfect world. If nothing else, if we were all merciful, the world would change drastically.

One night in 1935, Fiorello H. La Guardia, mayor of New York, showed up at a night court in the poorest ward of the city. He dismissed the judge for the evening and took over the bench. One case involved an elderly woman who was caught stealing bread to feed her grandchildren. La Guardia said, "I've got to punish you. Ten dollars or ten days in jail."

As he spoke, he threw \$10 into his hat. He then fined everyone in the courtroom 50 cents for living in a city "where a person has to steal bread so her grandchildren can eat." The hat was passed around, and the woman left the courtroom with her fine paid and an additional \$47.50.

LaGuardia was merciful. Seeing the injustice of living in a world that is rarely merciful, he showed mercy; he lived God's mission.

May we all live what the Lord taught us through his son.

The combined Sunday School will be presented by use of a Facebook group.


This class is studying the book of 1 Kings and is taught by Jack Carter. The class is a live stream presented every Sunday morning and everyone is invited to participate.


