**Exodus 20:3-4, 7-9, 12-17, 20**

Then God spoke all these words:

<sup>3</sup> You shall have no other gods before me.

<sup>4</sup> You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above, or is on the earth beneath, or is in the water under the earth.

<sup>7</sup> You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the LORD your God, for the LORD will not acquit anyone who misuses his name.

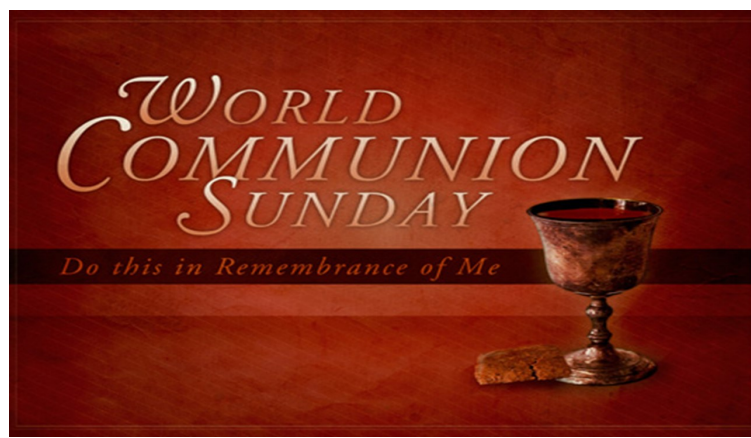
