
${ }^{7}$ Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. ${ }^{8}$ Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. ${ }^{9}$ God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so we might live through him. ${ }^{10}$ In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. ${ }^{11}$ Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. ${ }^{12}$ No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.
${ }^{13}$ By this we know we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. ${ }^{14}$ And we have seen and do testify the Father has sent his Son as the Savior of the world. ${ }^{15}$ God abides in those who confess Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. ${ }^{16}$ So we have known and believe the love God has for us.

God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. ${ }^{17}$ Love has been perfected among us in this: we may have boldness on the day of judgment, because as he is, so are we in this world. ${ }^{18}$ There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. ${ }^{19} \mathrm{We}$ love because he first loved us. ${ }^{\mathbf{2 0}}$ Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. ${ }^{21}$ The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.

During the 17th century, Oliver Cromwell, Lord Protector of England, sentenced a soldier to be shot for his crimes. The execution was to take place at the ringing of the evening curfew bell. However, the bell did not sound. The soldier's fiancé had climbed into the belfry and clung to the great clapper of the bell to prevent it from striking. When she was summoned by Cromwell to account for her actions, she wept as she showed him her bruised and bleeding hands. Cromwell's heart was touched, and he said, "Your lover shall live because of your sacrifice. Curfew shall not ring tonight!" God said, "Death shall not prevail because of my son's sacrifice. But you shall have life eternal." May God hold you in His loving arms always, Wes

The United States was one of the first countries in the world to celebrate Arbor Day, a holiday dedicated to tree planting. National Arbor Day in the USA is celebrated on the last Friday in April. Besides, each state celebrates its own state tree planting holiday. Arbor Day was founded by Julius Sterling Morton, a Nebraska newspaper editor, agriculturalist and statesman. Morton was a respected agriculturalist fascinated with trees, he planted numerous trees on his estate.

Currently, his former mansion and estate serve as Arbor Lodge State Historical Park. Morton came up with the idea of celebrating Arbor Day in the early 1870s. The first celebration was held in Nebraska on April 10, 1872. Its participants planted an estimated one million trees throughout the state. By the 1920s, each state had passed laws that stipulated a certain day to be state Arbor Day. In some states, the holiday was named Arbor and Bird Day. In Nebraska, Arbor Day is a civic holiday. National Arbor Day in the United States was established as a state holiday in 1885. It was moved from April 10 (its original date proposed by Morton) to April 22 (Morton's birthday). In 1989, the holiday was moved to the last Friday in April. On this day, Americans are encouraged to plant trees, bushes and plants (if weather conditions allow) and care for their national environment.

The Book of Samuel forms part of the narrative history of Israel in the Nevi'im or "prophets" section of the Old Testament called the Deuteronomistic history, a series of books (Joshua, Judges, Samuel, and Kings) that constitute a theological history of the Israelites and aim to explain God's law for Israel under the guidance of the prophets. According to Jewish tradition, the book was written by Samuel, with additions by the prophets Gad and Nathan. Modern scholarly thinking is the entire Deuteronomistic history was composed in the period c. 630-540 BC by combining a number of independent texts of various ages.

Samuel begins with the prophet Samuel's birth and God's call to him as a boy. The story of the Ark of the Covenant that follows tells of Israel's oppression by the Philistines, which brought about Samuel's anointing of Saul as Israel's first king. But Saul proved unworthy and God's choice turned to David, who defeated Israel's enemies, purchased the threshing floor (2 Samuel 24:24), where his son, Solomon built the Temple and brought the Ark to Jerusalem. God then promised David and his successors an everlasting dynasty.
