#### **2** Corinthians 4:13-5:1

But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture—"I believed, and so I spoke"—we also believe, and so we speak, <sup>14</sup> because we know the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. <sup>15</sup> Yes, everything is for your sake, so grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

<sup>16</sup> So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. <sup>17</sup> For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure, <sup>18</sup> because we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal.

**5** For we know if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

Sometimes we are asked to try again in this world. God calls us to be faithful and continue to try when our efforts to spread His Word and Ministry are thwarted. It's not always comfortable but it is always rewarding when we accomplish God's work. Remember, Jesus wasn't able to convince everyone his mission was from God, but God did not call him to be successful just faithful. Jesus knew this and went to the cross. Do you have that kind of faith?




