

2 Timothy 1:1-14

³I am grateful to God—whom I worship with a clear conscience, as my ancestors did—when I remember you constantly in my prayers, night and day. ⁴Recalling your tears, I long to see you so I may be filled with joy. ⁵I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that lived first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, lives in you. ⁶For this reason I remind you to rekindle the gift of God within you through the laying on of my hands, ⁷ for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline.

⁸ Do not be ashamed, then, of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner, but join with me in suffering for the gospel, in the power of God, ⁹ who saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works but according to his own purpose and grace, and this grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, ¹⁰ but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior Jesus Christ, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. ¹¹ For this gospel I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher, ¹² and for this reason I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know the one in whom I have put my trust, and I am sure he is able to guard the deposit I have entrusted to him. ¹³ Hold to the standard of sound teaching you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁴ Guard the good deposit entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us.

Reading this passage from Paul's hand, we can see the important points he wishes us to grasp. For example: Sincere faith, a faith that has been passed down from generation to generation. A spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline. Not being ashamed of the Gospel. Sound teaching

Paul calls us to be faithful followers, bold followers, and loving followers of Jesus. Are you?

PONY EXPRESS NEWSLETTER RELEASE 9/26

The Pony Express returns October 2, 2022! In the past, Central Christian has achieved great success with the Pony Express Stewardship Program. It is a way to determine the estimated giving of our members for the coming year. The estimates of giving will be the basis of forming the church budget for 2023. Inflation is running at an all-time high. The goal this year is to increase the current budget and strive for \$233,000 in commitments. Each member is asked to prayerfully and privately estimate the amount he or she will be able to give during the coming year.

There are 6 Trail Bosses who will oversee the passage of the saddlebags along 6 routes to our church members. The Trail Bosses are: Joan Carter, Lois Moore, Bob Kern, Connie Spears, Julia Carpenter and John Beeson.

The program involves teamwork and runs very much like the Pony Express of our country's past. Each member, after completing an estimated giving card, places it in a sealed envelope in the saddlebag. The saddlebag is passed to the next member on the list so that it arrives back to its final destination, the Trail Boss. All estimates are confidential. If passing the saddlebag is a problem, contact the Trail Boss whose information will be on the bag. The success of the program, as in the past, is due to our members' commitment and ability to work as a team.





The Season of Creation begins on September 1, World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, and ends on September 30.

Individuals and communities are invited to participate through prayer, sustainability projects and advocacy.

- Prayer: Host an ecumenical prayer gathering that unites all Christians for the care of our common home.
- Sustainability: Lead a cleanup project that helps all of creation thrive.

Advocacy: Raise your voice for climate justice by participating in or leading an ongoing campaign, such as the fossil fuel divestment movement.

We invite you to plan your own participation for the season. As a first step, visit seasonofcreation.org.

For this year, the proposed theme is: "Listening to the voice of creation" with the symbol of the burning bush. During the COVID-19 pandemic, many have become familiar with the concept of being silenced in conversations. Many voices are silenced in the public discourse on climate change and the ethics of Earth conservation.

They are voices of those who suffer the impacts of climate change. They are voices of people who possess ancestral wisdom about how to live with gratitude within the limits of Earth. They are voices of a diminishing diversity of species rather than humans. It is the voice of the Earth.

Taking action during the Season of Creation is living out our faith.

The Church, following the teachings of Jesus, from the Social Doctrine, throughout time has exhorted believers to work for the common good, which requires dignifying life in all its forms, caring for the common home, committing to the construction of more just, supportive, fraternal and peaceful societies, among other fundamental aspects.

Often, when we speak of creation, it is related to nature, animals, landscapes, the sun, the moon, but rarely do we become aware that the human being is the culmination of the God's creative work, "God saw all he had made, and indeed it was very good." (Gen 1:31), Scripture states, implying that God, after the creation of man and woman, is pleased to see all their work.

In this regard, it is important to mention in the Bible there are several references to the creative work of the God, who made heaven and earth, the sea and all that is in them (Rom 4:24) and, moreover, lovingly arranges everything to sustain and promote harmony: *"Look at the birds in the sky. They do not sow or reap or gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them"* (Mt 6:26).

In other words, he is not only a creator God, but a loving God who tenderly cares for the work of his hands and has a vision of fraternity for all humanity.

Accordingly, the Season of Creation is a celebration that allows all people to recognize ourselves as "the work of the Lord's creative act," to contemplate nature and all that dwells in it, and to care for our Common Home.

It is necessary for all believers to join in the celebration of the Season of Creation. Since "<u>what was good in the</u> <u>eves of God has become an exploitable thing in the hands of man"</u>, and it is urgent as Church we implement concrete actions towards care and preservation.

What's Been Happening in Disciples Men?

It has been quite a while since we published the last edition of *The Voice of Disciples Men*. Alex and I sincerely apologize for that. Rest assured, since the last publication, <u>much has been happening</u> in the world of Disciples Men.

Disciples Men is a very part-time ministry for both Alex and me. That is not by our choice or the choice of Disciples Home Missions. It is a reflection of the financial realities denominations as a whole are facing. Alex and I both have other ministry responsibilities beyond Disciples Men. So, passion, not profit, drives our desire to serve. This reality requires us to prioritize our time in ways that, we believe, provide the best return.

Beyond our weekly Zoom meetings, we devoted our time to the following.

The Jesus Way Journey was first released in 2020. We published it as a pdf rather than going through the normal "book" publishing process to reduce the cost to the church and to allow for easy revisions as warranted. Since its release, we have received great feedback on how to make it better. So, Alex and I took a hard look at the materials, line by line. We incorporated much of the feedback received, and we discovered other changes that would strengthen the resource.

Now, as of this week, that work is completed. The 2022 Edition of *The Jesus Way* is available for purchase. We are very excited about this newly revised resource for men's ministry and encourage you to prayerfully consider using it in your congregation.

The Disciples Men's Podcast continues to be a wonderful opportunity for Alex and me to introduce the work of Disciples Men to the wonderful leaders of our church and to introduce these wonderful leaders to all of you. Each leader we have interviewed has been very supportive of our work and committed to supporting this ministry in any way that they can.

In addition, Alex and I use the podcast to introduce current and pertinent topics that impact our work as Disciples Men. We want us to wrestle with the question, how is God calling us to respond to these challenges if we are to be faithful to God?

Thanks to Alex's diligent work, *Disciples Men's Podcast* is now available on Apple Podcasts, Spotify, and Amazon Music/Audible. Just go to your favorite podcast app, search for Disciples Men and click to become a follower. Here is a list of our most recent podcasts:

There is much good news to share coming from the GCDM.

Alex and I continue to keynote regional men's events in-person and by Zoom. It has been a real blessing to return to face-to-face gatherings this year.

In the final stages of production is a new video podcast entitled, "Contexts and Contrasts." It is our intent to use this resource to make the case for revitalizing congregational men's ministries. Stay tuned!

On the drawing board is a new pilot ministry. Alex and I will host a weekly men's study by way of Zoom. There will be no cost to participate. Seating will be limited and require men to sign up to reserve a seat. We plan to do a trial run of four to six weeks to test the waters for interest and format. Then, using the feedback we receive, we will decide if the interest is sufficient to warrant making this a regular feature of Disciples Men.



In our Sanctuary/Education building we have three areas where we try to maintain an energy efficient temperature; that can be adjusted as needed. These areas are the sanctuary, the parlor, and HeBrews. Each area has their own controls.

In an attempt to help us control the cost of heating and cooling our Sanctuary/Education building we are asking everyone to help keep doors in these areas shut at all times. When doors are left open, the heat goes up the staircases to the hallway and upper rooms and the A/C goes into rooms we are not using downstairs.

The parlor has two doors we need to keep closed, HeBrews has two doors into hallway we need to keep closed, and the kitchen door to the hallway we need to keep closed. In the area where the water fountain and women's restroom are, the door going up the steps into back of the sanctuary and the door in the hallway leading to HeBrews need to be kept closed.

With everyone's help we can save on the cost of gas and electricity.

The Journey Sunday School Class will continue our study of

1 John

We hope you will join us. *The Journey class* meets in the Library in the Community Center.

The **First Epistle of John** is the first of the Johannine epistles of the New Testament, and the fourth of the catholic epistles. There is no scholarly consensus as to the authorship of the Johannine works. The author of the First Epistle is termed John the Evangelist, who most scholars believe is not the same as John the Apostle. Most scholars believe the three Johannine epistles have the same author, but there is no consensus if this was also the author of the Gospel of John.

This epistle was probably written in Ephesus between 95 and 110 AD. The author advises Christians on how to discern true teachers: by their ethics, their proclamation of Jesus in the flesh, and by their love. The original text was written in Koine Greek. The epistle is divided into five chapters.
