## Matthew 8:5-13

When Jesus had entered Capernaum, a centurion came to him, asking for help. <sup>6</sup>“Lord,” he said, “my servant lies at home paralyzed, suffering terribly.”

<sup>7</sup> Jesus said to him, “Shall I come and heal him?”

<sup>8</sup> The centurion replied, “Lord, I do not deserve to have you come under my roof. But just say the word, and my servant will be healed. <sup>9</sup> For I myself am a man under authority, with soldiers under me. I tell this one, ‘Go,’ and he goes; and that one, ‘Come,’ and he comes. I say to my servant, ‘Do this,’ and he does it.”

<sup>10</sup> When Jesus heard this, he was amazed and said to those following him, “Truly I tell you, I have not found anyone in Israel with such great faith. <sup>11</sup> I say to you that many will come from the east and the west and will take their places at the feast with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven. <sup>12</sup> But the subjects of the kingdom will be thrown outside, into the darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.”

<sup>13</sup> Then Jesus said to the centurion, “Go! Let it be done just as you believed it would.” And his servant was healed at that moment.

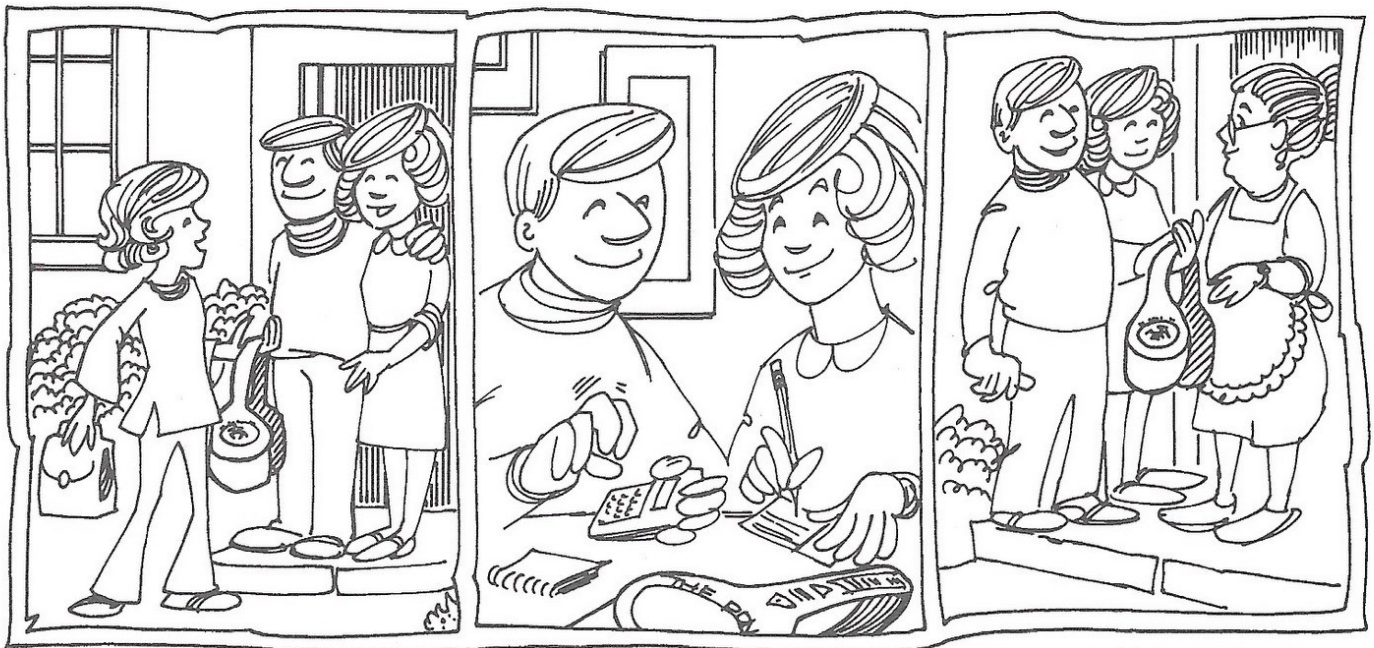

So often, we get “stuck” in a stage of grief and remain there. This is the reason groups that deal with grief are so important; they help us move through the stages so we can move forward and evolve. Sadly, such groups are often not advertised, promoted, or supported by local organizations.

Here at Central Christian Church, we are very blessed to have such a group and we want to promote this organizations work. The ***Hope Remains*** Chapter of Texarkana meets in the Community Room on the ***2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of each month from 6 to 8 p.m.*** The focus is for parents and grandparents grieving the loss of a child or grandchild.

The mission of Hope Remains is to offer a safe place where any and all emotions may be freely expressed. There may be tears shed at the meetings. There may be laughter and smiles shared as precious memories of a child, grandchild, or sibling is recalled. And there will always be acceptance, friendship and hope offered at the meetings.

## What's Been Happening in Disciples Men?

It has been quite a while since we published the last edition of *The Voice of Disciples Men*. Alex and I sincerely apologize for that. Rest assured, since the last publication, much has been happening in the world of Disciples Men.

Disciples Men is a very part-time ministry for both Alex and me. That is not by our choice or the choice of Disciples Home Missions. It is a reflection of the financial realities denominations as a whole are facing. Alex and I both have other ministry responsibilities beyond Disciples Men. So, passion, not profit, drives our desire to serve. This reality requires us to prioritize our time in ways that, we believe, provide the best return.

Beyond our weekly Zoom meetings, we devoted our time to the following.

***The Jesus Way Journey*** was first released in 2020. We published it as a pdf rather than going through the normal "book" publishing process to reduce the cost to the church and to allow for easy revisions as warranted. Since its release, we have received great feedback on how to make it better. So, Alex and I took a hard look at the materials, line by line. We incorporated much of the feedback received, and we discovered other changes that would strengthen the resource.

Now, as of this week, that work is completed. The 2022 Edition of *The Jesus Way* is available for purchase. We are very excited about this newly revised resource for men's ministry and encourage you to prayerfully consider using it in your congregation.

***The Disciples Men's Podcast*** continues to be a wonderful opportunity for Alex and me to introduce the work of Disciples Men to the wonderful leaders of our church and to introduce these wonderful leaders to all of you. Each leader we have interviewed has been very supportive of our work and committed to supporting this ministry in any way that they can.

In addition, Alex and I use the podcast to introduce current and pertinent topics that impact our work as Disciples Men. We want us to wrestle with the question, how is God calling us to respond to these challenges if we are to be faithful to God?

Thanks to Alex's diligent work, *Disciples Men's Podcast* is now available on Apple Podcasts, Spotify, and Amazon Music/Audible. Just go to your favorite podcast app, search for Disciples Men and click to become a follower. Here is a list of our most recent podcasts:

Upcoming podcasts include conversations about the remaining two Touchstones, an interview with new Disciples Home Missions President Dr. Chris Dorsey, and the wonderful work of the Executive Committee of the General Conference of Disciples Men. There is much good news to share coming from the GCDM.

Alex and I continue to keynote regional men's events in-person and by Zoom. It has been a real blessing to return to face-to-face gatherings this year.

In the final stages of production is a new video podcast entitled, "Contexts and Contrasts." It is our intent to use this resource to make the case for revitalizing congregational men's ministries. Stay tuned!

On the drawing board is a new pilot ministry. Alex and I will host a weekly men's study by way of Zoom. There will be no cost to participate. Seating will be limited and require men to sign up to reserve a seat. We plan to do a trial run of four to six weeks to test the waters for interest and format. Then, using the feedback we receive, we will decide if the interest is sufficient to warrant making this a regular feature of Disciples Men.

From the 4th century, feasts commemorating all Christian martyrs were held in various places, on various dates near Easter and Pentecost. In the 9th century, some churches in the British Isles began holding the commemoration of all saints on 1 November, and in the 9th century this was extended to the whole Catholic church by Pope Gregory IV.

In Western Christianity, it is still celebrated on 1 November by the Roman Catholic Church as well as many Protestant churches, as the Disciples of Christ, Lutheran, Anglican, and Methodist traditions. The Eastern Orthodox Church and associated Eastern Catholic and Eastern Lutheran churches celebrate it on the first Sunday after Pentecost.

The Church of the East and the Syro-Malabar Church and Chaldean Catholic Church, the latter of which is in communion with Rome, celebrates All Saints' Day on the first Friday after Easter Sunday. In the Coptic Orthodox tradition, All Saints' Day is on Nayrouz, celebrated on September 11. The day is both the start of the Coptic new year and its first month, Thout.

In our Sanctuary/Education building we have three areas where we try to maintain an energy efficient temperature; that can be adjusted as needed. These areas are the sanctuary, the parlor, and HeBrews. Each area has their own controls.

In an attempt to help us control the cost of heating and cooling our Sanctuary/Education building we are asking everyone to help keep doors in these areas shut at all times. When doors are left open, the heat goes up the staircases to the hallway and upper rooms and the A/C goes into rooms we are not using downstairs.

The parlor has two doors we need to keep closed, HeBrews has two doors into hallway we need to keep closed, and the kitchen door to the hallway we need to keep closed. In the area where the water fountain and women's restroom are, the door going up the steps into back of the sanctuary and the door in the hallway leading to HeBrews need to be kept closed.

With everyone's help we can save on the cost of gas and electricity.

## **1 John**

The **First Epistle of John** is the first of the Johannine epistles of the New Testament, and the fourth of the catholic epistles. There is no scholarly consensus as to the authorship of the Johannine works. The author of the First Epistle is termed John the Evangelist, who most scholars believe is not the same as John the Apostle. Most scholars believe the three Johannine epistles have the same author, but there is no consensus if this was also the author of the Gospel of John.

This epistle was probably written in Ephesus between 95 and 110 AD. The author advises Christians on how to discern true teachers: by their ethics, their proclamation of Jesus in the flesh, and by their love. The original text was written in Koine Greek. The epistle is divided into five chapters.

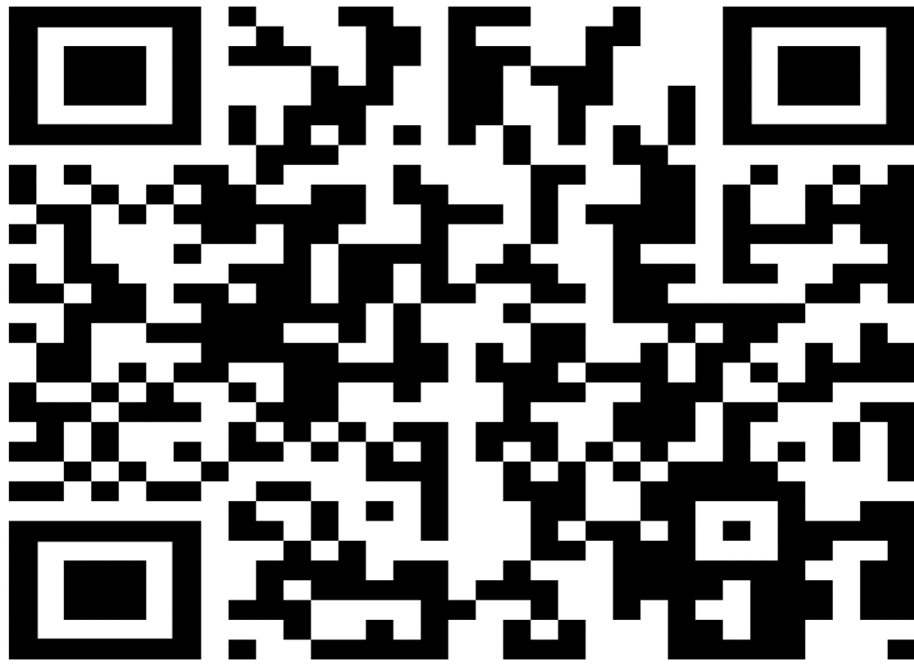
