Galatians 4:4-7

⁴ But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, ⁵ in order to redeem those who were under the law, so we might receive adoption as children. ⁶ And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" ⁷ So you are no longer a servant but a child, and if a child then also an heir through God.

A teenage boy and girl were sitting in a swing on her parents front porch way up in the mountains of North Carolina. They spent a lot of time there away from everyone just them. They would talk about all kinds of things. Things about when they had grown up. What would they do: go to college, which for them meant moving away from home and getting enough money to go. For him it would mean getting a job or going into the military for some good job training. Would they have a family together?

Every Friday evening it was the same. He really liked coming to see her, but her mother's cooking was another good thing about the visit.

When he got ready to go, he would hold her hand and tell her he would see her next Friday and hug her. But one night he was feeling tender towards her so he hugged her and said at the bottom of the porch stairs: You know I love you so much I would fight the biggest man, swim the deepest ocean, climb the highest mountain because I love you so much. He kissed her for the first time and turned to leave. Looking back at her as he opened the gate to leave, he said, "I'll see you next Friday if it doesn't rain."

Interesting note on the difference between us and God. Notice in Paul's letter to the Galatians he points out we are no longer a servant but a child, and if a child then also an heir through God. As you probably know, heirs have the same rights and privileges as blood kin, so to speak. An heir is not relegated to a lower or less important status, but an equal status. Therefore, an heir is family. That being said, since we are part of God's family, God is always with us come rain or shine.

Unfortunately, we as human beings pledge our love and loyalty to God, but often find ourselves abandoning Him. Like the young man, it's "See you tomorrow God........if it doesn't rain." Why our loyalty to God cannot be as strong as God's loyalty to us is incumbent in our humanness. That is, we allow distraction and dissatisfaction to rule our emotions rather than our emotions being ruled by our loyalty to God. Have you done a loyalty check lately when it comes to God?

The First Epistle to Timothy is one of three letters in the New Testament of the Bible often grouped together as the pastoral epistles, along with Second Timothy and Titus. The letter, traditionally attributed to the Apostle Paul, consists mainly of counsels to his younger colleague and delegate Timothy regarding his ministry in Ephesus (1:3). These counsels include instructions on the organization of the Church and the responsibilities resting on certain groups of leaders therein as well as exhortations to faithfulness in maintaining the truth amid surrounding errors.

Most modern scholars consider the pastoral epistles to have been written after Paul's death, although "a small and declining number of scholars still argue for Pauline authorship".

In our Sanctuary/Education building we have three areas where we try to maintain an energy efficient temperature; that can be adjusted as needed. These areas are the sanctuary, the parlor, and HeBrews. Each area has their own controls.

In an attempt to help us control the cost of heating and cooling our Sanctuary/Education building we are asking everyone to help keep doors in these areas shut at all times. When doors are left open, the heat goes up the staircases to the hallway and upper rooms and the A/C goes into rooms we are not using downstairs.

The parlor has two doors we need to keep closed, HeBrews has two doors into hallway we need to keep closed, and the kitchen door to the hallway we need to keep closed. In the area where the water fountain and women's restroom are, the door going up the steps into back of the sanctuary and the door in the hallway leading to HeBrews need to be kept closed.

With everyone's help we can save on the cost of gas and electricity.




