Mark 8:27-38

Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi, and on the way he asked his disciples, “Who do people say that I am?” ²⁸ And they answered him, “John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets.” ²⁹ He asked them, “But who do you say I am?” Peter answered him, “You are the Messiah.” ³⁰ And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him.

³¹ Then he began to teach them the Son of Man must undergo great suffering and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes and be killed and after three days rise again. ³² He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. ³³ But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, “Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.”

³⁴ He called the crowd with his disciples and said to them, “If any wish to come after me, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ³⁵ For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. ³⁶ For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? ³⁷ Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? ³⁸ Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels.”

Question: In your daily life what do you set your mind on? On divine things or human things? I believe for most of us it is human things. Why? Because it is quite natural to do so. We live in a human world, with human concerns and problems. It is the “human” thing to do. But Jesus teaches us to set our mind on divine things for the very reason it takes our minds OFF of our concerns and problems AND it takes the burden of such things off of us to share them with God. Remember these words: “Come to Me, all *you* who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.” Set your mind on the Lord and give your mind a rest.

ELDER EDUCATION

The following is intended to assist the Elders of Central Christian Church in learning the duties of an Elder according to the By-Laws of CCC.

Elders are not to exceed six (6) in number for a term of three (3) years.

An Elder may be removed from Eldership if it becomes apparent his/her conduct is inconsistent with the teachings of Christ and expectations of the congregation. The Elders shall investigate any charges, and if the charges are founded then make their recommendation for removal to the congregation. Removal shall take a simple majority vote by the congregation.

Elders primarily shall be responsible for the spiritual life and development of the congregation, preside at the Lord's Table, assist and share with the Minister(s) in the conduct of Pastoral functions and provide supportive counsel for the Minister(s) regarding the spiritual life and development of the congregation.

The six (6) Elders elected for the Board are "voting" Elders. All other Elders are encouraged to attend Board meetings with the understanding they are none voting members.

DEACON EDUCATION

The following is intended to assist the Deacons of Central Christian Church in the duties of a Deacon according to the By-Laws of CCC.

Deacons are not to exceed fifteen (15) in number for a term of three (3) years.

Deacons primarily shall be responsible for the maintenance and growth of the congregation through its individual members and corporate life in witness in the community and in the world.

The Deacons shall be called upon to distribute communion to the congregation, as well as collect the tithe and offering during the worship service.

The Deacon chair shall coordinate the distribution of communion elements and the collection of the tithe and offering to ensure it is in a timely and organized manner. The Deacon chair shall ensure Deacons are in sufficient number for each service.

Saturday, September 21st, is **Zero Emissions Day**. It is annually observed for the following purposes:

1. to raise awareness of the impact of carbon emissions on air quality and climate change.
2. to encourage individuals, organizations, and corporations to reduce the use of fossil fuels in daily life.
3. To promote the use of renewable energy.

Inception:

Zero Emissions Day was started back in 2008 in Canada as a day to minimize the use of electricity generated by fossil fuels.

History:

In 2008, Ken Wallace launched a website in Nova Scotia, Canada, calling for September 21 to be a day of zero fossil fuel consumption.

Nowadays, Zero Emissions Day has evolved into a worldwide movement that aims to stop the use of fossil fuels for 24 hours that day.



On car-free days, people are encouraged to travel by means other than cars. Some cities, like **Jakarta** and **Tehran**, have weekly car-free days. Other such days are annual. World Car Free Day is celebrated on September 22. Organized events are held in some cities and countries.

The events, which vary by location, give motorists and commuters an idea of their locality with fewer cars. The concept dates from the 1970s but was popularized in the 1990s.

Currently **Bogotá** holds the world's largest car-free weekday event covering the entire city. The first car-free day was held in February 2000 and became institutionalized through a public referendum.

The First Epistle to Timothy is one of three letters in the New Testament of the Bible often grouped together as the pastoral epistles, along with Second Timothy and Titus. The letter, traditionally attributed to the Apostle Paul, consists mainly of counsels to his younger colleague and delegate Timothy regarding his ministry in Ephesus (1:3). These counsels include instructions on the organization of the Church and the responsibilities resting on certain groups of leaders therein as well as exhortations to faithfulness in maintaining the truth amid surrounding errors.

Most modern scholars consider the pastoral epistles to have been written after Paul's death, although "a small and declining number of scholars still argue for Pauline authorship".

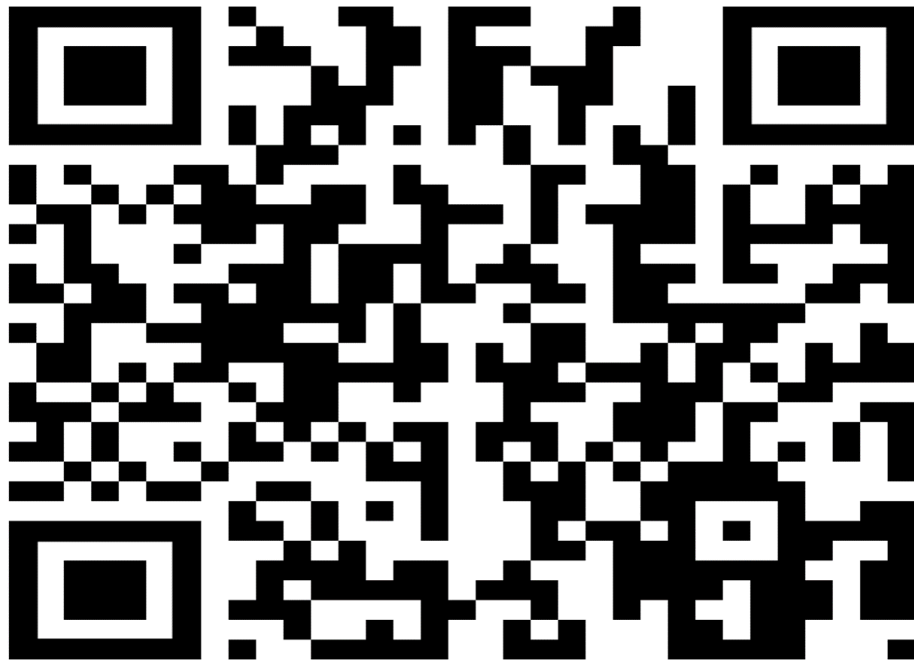
