James 5:13-20

Are any among you suffering? They should pray. Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise. ¹⁴ Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. ¹⁵ The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up, and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven. ¹⁶ Therefore confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, so you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective. ¹⁷ Elijah was a human like us, and he prayed fervently it might not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the earth. ¹⁸ Then he prayed again, and heaven gave rain, and earth yielded its harvest.

¹⁹ My brothers and sisters, if anyone among you wanders from the truth and is brought back by another, ²⁰ you should know whoever brings back a sinner from wandering will save the sinner's soul from death and will cover a multitude of sins.

Scripture is certainly wonderful in illuminating the joy of belief and the need for faith. Yet, as illuminating as it is, it is also very important we look at the context and the time in which it was written. For example, we know in today's world if we are sick, we consult a doctor. After all, doctors were not plentiful in James' time and the doctors who were available were limited in their ability to help simply due to the limitation of medications and medical knowledge of the time. To pray in difficult times, to be cheerful and sing and to talk with friends who can help you process and work through situations are all very valid in today's world. And to remember the patriarchs and prophets in the days of old were human, not gods or demi-gods is also very important to keep in mind, as James points out. But perhaps the most important words in this passage from James is this:

".....anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven."

It is important for all of us to remember God forgives sin. Knowing that, it is equally important to remember we must forgive ourselves. So often, that is the most difficult thing to do.

May the God of love and forgiveness abide in you always, Wes


IN THE COMMUNITY ROOM



THE WAGER: A Tale of Shipwreck, Mutiny and Murder

On January 28, 1742, a ramshackle vessel of patched-together wood and cloth washed up on the coast of Brazil. Inside were thirty emaciated men, barely alive, and they had an extraordinary tale to tell. They were survivors of His Majesty's Ship the Wager, a British vessel that had left England in 1740 on a secret mission during an imperial war with Spain. While the Wager had been chasing a Spanish treasure-filled galleon known as "the prize of all the oceans," it had wrecked on a desolate island off the coast of Patagonia. The men, after being marooned for months and facing starvation, built the flimsy craft and sailed for more than a hundred days, traversing nearly 3,000 miles of storm-wracked seas. They were greeted as heroes.

But then ... six months later, another, even more decrepit craft landed on the coast of Chile. This boat contained just three castaways, and they told a very different story. The thirty sailors who landed in Brazil were not heroes – they were mutineers. The first group responded with countercharges of their own, of a tyrannical and murderous senior officer and his henchmen. It became clear that while stranded on the island the crew had fallen into anarchy, with warring factions fighting for dominion over the barren wilderness. As accusations of treachery and murder flew, the Admiralty convened a court martial to determine who was telling the truth. The stakes were life-and-death—for whomever the court found guilty could hang.

The Wager is a grand tale of human behavior at the extremes told by one of our greatest nonfiction writers. Grann's recreation of the hidden world on a British warship rivals the work of Patrick O'Brian, his portrayal of the castaways' desperate straits stands up to the classics of survival writing such as *The Endurance*, and his account of the court martial has the savvy of a Scott Turow thriller. As always with Grann's work, the incredible twists of the narrative hold the reader spellbound.

This Book Club is for Men AND Women, and we hope both will read this book and join the discussion.

The First Epistle to Timothy is one of three letters in the New Testament of the Bible often grouped together as the pastoral epistles, along with Second Timothy and Titus. The letter, traditionally attributed to the Apostle Paul, consists mainly of counsels to his younger colleague and delegate Timothy regarding his ministry in Ephesus (1:3). These counsels include instructions on the organization of the Church and the responsibilities resting on certain groups of leaders therein as well as exhortations to faithfulness in maintaining the truth amid surrounding errors.

Most modern scholars consider the pastoral epistles to have been written after Paul's death, although "a small and declining number of scholars still argue for Pauline authorship".

ELDER EDUCATION

The following is intended to assist the Elders of Central Christian Church in learning the duties of an Elder according to the By-Laws of CCC.

Elders are not to exceed six (6) in number for a term of three (3) years.

An Elder may be removed from Eldership if it becomes apparent his/her conduct is inconsistent with the teachings of Christ and expectations of the congregation. The Elders shall investigate any charges, and if the charges are founded then make their recommendation for removal to the congregation. Removal shall take a simple majority vote by the congregation.

Elders primarily shall be responsible for the spiritual life and development of the congregation, preside at the Lord's Table, assist and share with the Minister(s) in the conduct of Pastoral functions and provide supportive counsel for the Minister(s) regarding the spiritual life and development of the congregation.

The six (6) Elders elected for the Board are "voting" Elders. All other Elders are encouraged to attend Board meetings with the understanding they are none voting members.

DEACON EDUCATION

The following is intended to assist the Deacons of Central Christian Church in the duties of a Deacon according to the By-Laws of CCC.

Deacons are not to exceed fifteen (15) in number for a term of three (3) years.

Deacons primarily shall be responsible for the maintenance and growth of the congregation through its individual members and corporate life in witness in the community and in the world.

The Deacons shall be called upon to distribute communion to the congregation, as well as collect the tithe and offering during the worship service.

The Deacon chair shall coordinate the distribution of communion elements and the collection of the tithe and offering to ensure it is in a timely and organized manner. The Deacon chair shall ensure Deacons are in sufficient number for each service.


