Mark 13:1-8

As he came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, "Look, Teacher, what large stones and what large buildings!" ² Then Jesus asked him, "Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down."

When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately, ⁴ "Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign that all these things are about to be accomplished?" ⁵ Then Jesus began to say to them, "Beware that no one leads you astray. ⁶ Many will come in my name and say, 'I am he!' and they will lead many astray. ⁷ When you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come. ⁸ For nation will rise against nation and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birth pangs.

In this passage Jesus expresses concern for people being led astray by false teachings and prophecies. But what is clear from this passage is Jesus' belief these things would happen in the disciples' lifetime and therefore witnessed by the disciples.

Truth is, we have had false teachings and prophecies throughout history. How many times have you heard an evangelist or other persons say, "It's the end times!" When we have experienced extremely bad weather events or countries going to war with one another there have been cries of, "It's the end times!" Even when earthquakes have occurred, we have heard this declaration. However, as Jesus said in Matthew 24:36, "But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father."

Let us always remember this teaching. Only God knows when the end will come. "Only" God.



The novel explores the theme of love warped by greed and status seeking and takes its title from a line of Rupert Brooke's poem Tiare Tahiti. The novel famously helped F. Scott Fitzgerald gain Zelda Sayre's hand in marriage; its publication was her condition of acceptance.



The Journey Sunday School Class will be studying

Epistle to Titus

We hope you will join us for this important study.

The Journey class meets in the Library in the Community Center.

The Epistle to Titus is one of the three pastoral epistles (along with 1 Timothy and 2 Timothy) in the New Testament, historically attributed to Paul the Apostle. It is addressed to Saint Titus and describes the requirements and duties of presbyters/bishops.

Not mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles, Saint Titus was noted in Galatians (cf. Galatians 2:1, 3) where Paul wrote of journeying to Jerusalem with Barnabas, accompanied by Titus. He was then dispatched to Corinth, Greece, where he successfully reconciled the Christian community there with Paul, its founder. Titus was later left on the island of Crete to help organize the Church there, and later met back with the Apostle Paul in Nicopolis. He soon went to Dalmatia (now Croatia). According to Eusebius of Caesarea in the *Ecclesiastical History*, he served as the first bishop of Crete. He was buried in Cortyna (Gortyna), Crete; his head was later removed to Venice during the invasion of Crete by the Saracens in 832 and was enshrined in St Mark's Basilica, Venice, Italy.

- a. Conduct one's life in light of the teachings of Jesus Christ.
- b. **Promotion of good will** and Christian fellowship in the congregation and community.
- c. At the very least, seventy-five (75) percent attendance at worship services and stated meetings of the congregation.
- d. Regular financial and/or service contributions to the support of the congregation and its outreach program.
- e. Willingness to fulfill assignments on behalf of the congregation.
- f. Demonstrated skills of evident potential in carrying out responsibilities of the particular office.


