#### Colossians 1:15-28

The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. <sup>16</sup> For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him. <sup>17</sup> He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. <sup>18</sup> And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so in everything he might have the supremacy. <sup>19</sup> For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, <sup>20</sup> and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross.

<sup>21</sup>Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behavior. <sup>22</sup>But now he has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in his sight, without blemish and free from accusation—<sup>23</sup> if you continue in your faith, established and firm, and do not move from the hope held out in the gospel. This is the gospel you heard and has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven, and of which I, Paul, have become a servant.

Paul speaks of reconciliation, that is, our reconciliation to God, keeping in mind it was God who reconciled himself to us, not us to him. How wonderful it would be if we learn to be reconcilers like our God and make the first move for reconciliation. More importantly, we must be certain our move toward reconciliation is sincere and unconditional. Unlike:

The two had quarreled in the past and never restored their friendship. "You must," Hicks said to Lonsdale. "It is very unkind to be unfriendly at such a time. So, Lonsdale crossed the room and spoke to his enemy. "I wish you a happy New Year," he said, "but only one."

God has wished us a lifetime of forgiveness that we may be reconciled to him. May we do the same for others.

### The Journey Sunday School Class will be studying

### **Gospel of Mark**

### We hope you will join us for this important study. *The Journey class* meets in the Library in the Community Center.

Most scholars date Mark to closely after AD 70. They reject the traditional ascription to Mark the Evangelist, the companion of the Apostle Peter, which probably arose from the desire of early Christians to link the work to an authoritative figure, and believe it to be the work of an author working with various sources including collections of miracle stories, controversy stories, parables, and a passion narrative. It was traditionally placed second, and sometimes fourth, in the Christian canon, as an inferior abridgement of what was regarded as the most important gospel, Matthew. The Church has consequently derived its view of Jesus primarily from Matthew, secondarily from John, and only distantly from Mark. It was only in the 19th century that Mark came to be seen as the earliest of the four gospels, and as a source used by both Matthew and Luke. The hypothesis of Marcan priority (that Mark was written first) continues to be held by the majority of scholars today, and there is a new recognition of the author as an artist and theologian using a range of literary devices to convey his conception of Jesus as the authoritative yet suffering Son of God.
