

Acts 10:34-43

Then Peter began to speak to them: “I truly understand that God shows no partiality,³⁵ but in every people anyone who fears him and practices righteousness is acceptable to him.³⁶ You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all.³⁷ That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism John announced:³⁸ how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.³⁹ We are witnesses to all he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree,⁴⁰ but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear,⁴¹ not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead.

Many times, in scripture we read about “who were chosen,” “The chosen,” or “A chosen people.” Truth is, what the Gospel of Jesus Christ tells us is, “We are ALL chosen.” Rather than speak of being chosen as something special to a particular group of people, we should be speaking of how God has CHOSEN all whom He created as chosen. Chosen to live in the world He created. Chosen to breathe the air He created. Chosen to procreate and chosen to spread the word of His grace and mercy.

I was speaking with a friend and mentor last Saturday and he said, “I hear people talking about how Evangelism has changed and is different in today’s culture, but I don’t believe that for a minute. It’s the same as always. Tell the story of Christ. Just tell the story.”

As he always has, he made me think: Do Christians tell the story in today’s world?

So, my question for you is: Do you tell the story? After all, that’s where Evangelism begins.

May the God who CHOSE you be in your heart and mind always,


January is National Human Trafficking Prevention Month

In 2010, by presidential proclamation, President Obama declared January "[**National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month**](#)" and every year since, each president has followed this tradition.
